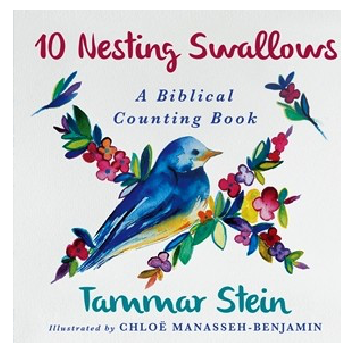

Is it God's Will?

Making Sense of Tragedy, Luck, and Hope in a World Gone Wrong

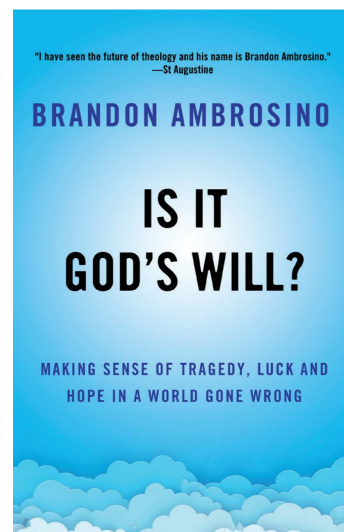

In the wake of two foiled assassination attempts while Donald Trump was campaigning for President, many of his supporters claimed Trump's survival was an act of Divine intervention, and a sign that Trump was favored by God. In his victory speech, Trump alluded to this. But his survival prompts other questions: Why did God spare Trump, but not the retiree sitting behind him? Why couldn't God have spared everyone that day? And if God is truly omnipotent, why do so many children die in gun violence every year?

To award-winning journalist and theologian Brandon Ambrosino, these mortal questions provide us with an opportunity to explore the great questions about Divine and human agency, especially in relation to human tragedy and a world that seems to be slipping into chaos. In this powerful and searching enquiry—in the vein of N.T. Wright and C.S. Lewis—Ambrosino argues that theologians have been poorly equipped to confront these questions, because many hang on to an omnipotent model of God. Exploring the daily tragedies that so many of us must contend—as well as a provocative and challenging reading of Christ's death and resurrection—Ambrosino provides us with the tools to understand and process grief but also presents a refreshing portrait of less a God of power, and more of one of persuasion, who can still provide a residue of hope in a world gone wrong.

Brandon Ambrosino is an award-winning journalist who has written for Politico, BBC, Vox, *Boston Globe*, *Globe & Mail*, *The Atlantic*, *Smithsonian*, *Economist*, *Washington Post*, and many other outlets. He is a Visiting Professor in the Augustine and Culture Seminar at Villanova University, where he also received his PHD in theology. His article "Someone's Gotta Tell the Freakin' Truth," on Jerry Falwell's tenure at Liberty University was the second most-read article on the internet in 2019. A regular contributor to *Commonweal* and *Christian Century*, he writes a monthly "Theology for Kids" column at US Catholic Magazine called *Childish*. He lives in Newark, Delaware.

Hope on the Border

Immigration, Incarceration, and the Power of Poetry

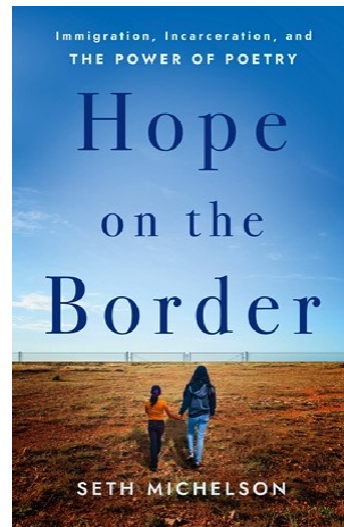
Seth Michelson

A powerful work of narrative nonfiction that humanizes the immigration crisis in the United States through the lens of undocumented, unaccompanied minors and the teacher who provides hope through poetry.

With unprecedented access, Seth Michelson takes readers inside the most restrictive maximum security detention center in the United States, where undocumented, unaccompanied youth are held in isolation. As the reader meets seven children who are part of the author's poetry workshop, we hear directly from the children in their own words, and learn the harsh reality of the lived experiences of migrating people. Their pasts, their struggles, their hopes, and their dreams are highlighted through the medium of poetry. The author shares these stories, as well as stories of mothers and children at a different facility in Dilley, Texas, infamous site of the death of 20-month old Maríee Juárez, whose death made front page headlines in 2018.

Each chapter is grounded in the voices and stories of migrating people whom the author has worked with directly. Through these stories, the reader learns the intricacies of our immigration system and the challenges migrants face as they work toward a better life. By sharing the resilience of the human spirit, the kindness of strangers, and the pervasiveness of our shared, human belief in the dignity of all people, the author hopes to inspire readers to act on behalf of these powerless children, whether by implementing a model poetry workshop in their own community or working with advocacy groups or legal aid groups to champion for change.

Seth Michelson is an award-winning professor who has gained recognition from the National Endowment of the Arts and the Fulbright Foundation. He is the author of academic articles, book introductions, film and book reviews, and fourteen books of poetry and poetry in translation. His work has been published in English and Spanish in Argentina, Mexico, England, and Italy, among other countries. He currently teaches at Washington and Lee University in Virginia where he is the chair of Latin American and Caribbean Studies. He lives in Charlottesville, Virginia.

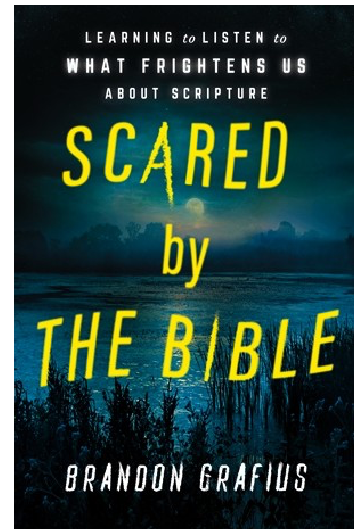

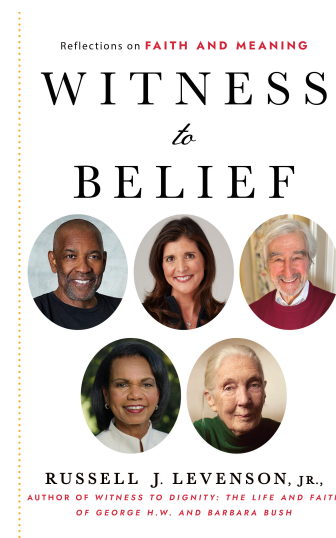

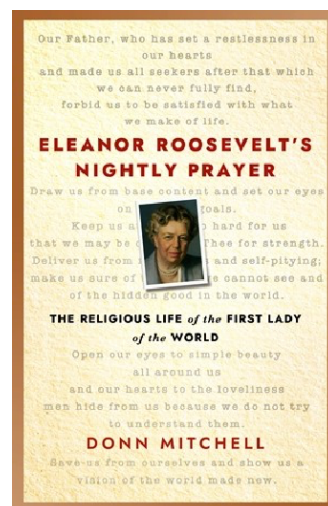
The Religious Life of the First Lady of the World

A great woman who was heavily involved in politics, Eleanor Roosevelt is considered one of the most important and beloved First Ladies and female leaders. Her faith and beliefs are commonly dismissed as confines of her upbringing that she broke free from; however, her dedication to the Episcopal Church and her reliance on Jesus's teachings imply otherwise. Her nightly prayer, famously recorded in her writing, demonstrates her approach to serving her community and nation, and her inspiration and strength in the politics she was involved in become apparent when understanding the context of her religion and considering the fulfillment of her beliefs through her actions. In reviewing observations from family members, her own writing, and her participation in the church, Mitchell examines the impact of Eleanor's faith on her work, and by extension, its impact on the world.

Donn Mitchell is a professor at Fordham University. He has previously taught at the General Theological Seminary, Princeton Theological Seminary, and Manhattan College. Mitchell is the author of *Tread the City's Streets Again: Frances Perkins Shares Her Theology*, and has contributed to *A Promise to All Generations*, edited by Kirsten Downey and Christopher Breiseth, as well as *Rebuilding Communion: Who Pays the Price?*, edited by Peter Francis. His work has appeared in *The Christian Century*, *The Living Church*, and *Anglican Theological Review*. He lives in Princeton, New Jersey.

Robert MacSwain is Associate Professor of Theology at the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, and a co-editor of *Anglican Theological Review*. He holds graduate degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary (M.Div.), the University of Edinburgh (M.Th.), and the University of St. Andrews (Ph.D.), as well as a postgraduate diploma in Anglican studies from Virginia Theological Seminary. He has authored or edited eight previous volumes in philosophy, theology, and Anglican studies. He is a priest of the Oratory of the Good Shepherd, an international Anglican religious society founded at Cambridge University in 1913. He lives in Sewanee, Tennessee.

Kelli Joyce is a candidate for the Ph.D. in Theological Studies at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee. She holds graduate degrees from Yale University (M.Div.) and the University of Durham (M.A.), and her research focuses on the intersection of doctrinal, liturgical, and queer theology. She has previously served as a parish priest in the Diocese of Arizona and as a member of General Convention's Task Force on Communion Across Difference, and she teaches for Bexley-Seabury. She lives in Nashville, Tennessee.

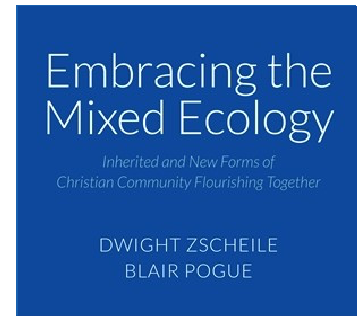

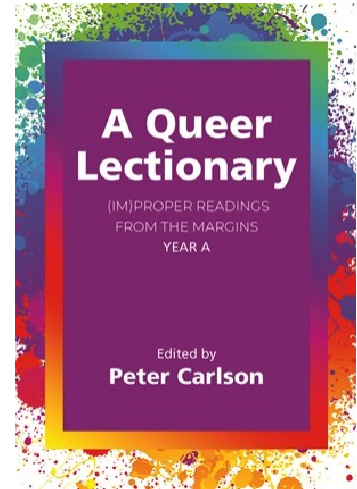

Leadership in a Shrinking Church

Finding New Vision in Unlikely Places

William H. Harrison

Theological and practical reflections on demographic change in the church.

Numerous churches are contending with the challenges posed by declining membership and attendance. While these trends have most recently been ascribed to the COVID-19 pandemic, the trajectory predates the pandemic and is likely to continue beyond it. William Harrison takes the perspective that demographic decline is merely a reality, rather than a failure to be resolved with new strategies, and examines the theological and ecclesiological questions posed by a shrinking church.

In theological and practical reflections, Harrison examines the twin crises of identity and leadership facing the church, arguing that in response to demographic change, churches must renew their outward focus on evangelism and service. These characteristics of a diaconal church are rooted in sacramental life and self-understanding in a sacramental world. At the same time, leaders must find ways to support these activities while managing decline. *Leadership in a Shrinking Church* connects theological reflection to mission by identifying some of the challenges presented by decline and connecting them to productive responses.

William H. Harrison is president of Lutheran Theological Seminary, Saskatoon. He is a priest in the Anglican Church of Canada and rostered pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada. Dr. Harrison has served in a variety of leadership and teaching roles with the church in educational, diocesan, and parish contexts. He has a PhD in Systematic Theology, along with other credentials in Political Science, English Literature, Theology, and Leadership. He has written two previous books in theology and religion. He lives in Kelowna, Canada.
